Martin Luther King Jr.



Martin Luther King Jr. was born to Reverend Martin Luther King Sr. and Alberta Williams King on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia. King was both a Baptist minister and a prominent leader in the African American Civil Rights Movement.
